

FY 2025 Funding Request for the National Institute of Nursing Research

Supporting Quality Patient Care, Improved Patient Outcomes, and Healthy Communities Through Nursing Science

<u>Background:</u> The National Institute of Nursing Research (NINR), a key part of the National Institutes of Health (NIH), funds essential research that forms the scientific foundation for clinical care and supports vital interdisciplinary training. Congressional investment in NINR tackles prevalent health challenges in the U.S., such as:

- Evaluating emergency preparedness responses.
- Improving community health outcomes and reducing health disparities.
- Identifying harmful environmental factors affecting maternal and newborn health.

<u>Importance of Increased Funding:</u> Enhanced funding for NINR is crucial for the advancement of nursing science, addressing the nation's critical health issues. The Friends of the National Institute of Nursing Research (FNINR) advocate for Congress to allocate at least \$210 million to NINR, emphasizing the following benefits:

- Creation of jobs in healthcare, improving patient-to-nursing staffing ratios.
- Reduction in hospital readmissions and shortened hospital stays, decreasing avoidable healthcare costs.
